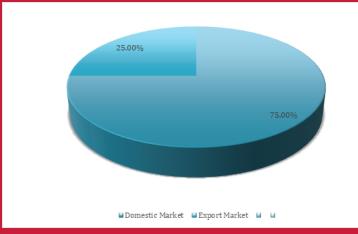
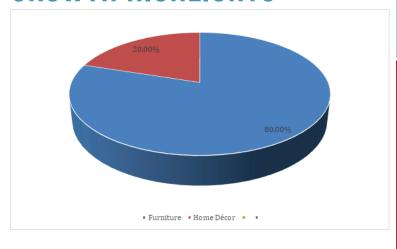


MARKET SNAPSHOT SEPTEMBER 2025



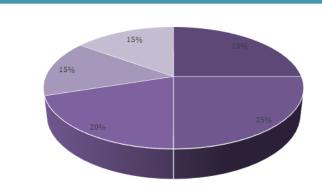
Bangladesh's furniture and home décor sector continued its growth trajectory in September 2025. The domestic market, valued at approximately Tk 300 billion, remains vibrant with annual growth rates hovering around 18–20%. Urbanization, rising middle-class incomes, and shifting lifestyle preferences have been drivers. Meanwhile. exports have maintained steady momentum. with Bangladesh-made furniture increasingly finding buyers in regional and global markets.

GROWTH HIGHLIGHTS



- Domestic Market: Strong demand from urban housing developments, modular furniture trends, and growing e-commerce penetration.
- Export Market: Regional shipments to South Asia and the Middle East performed well. Smaller boutique orders increased, driven by interest in crafted wood and rattan items.
- Home Décor: Decorative accessories, textiles, and sustainable décor items saw moderate but steady growth.

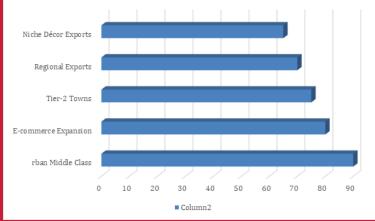

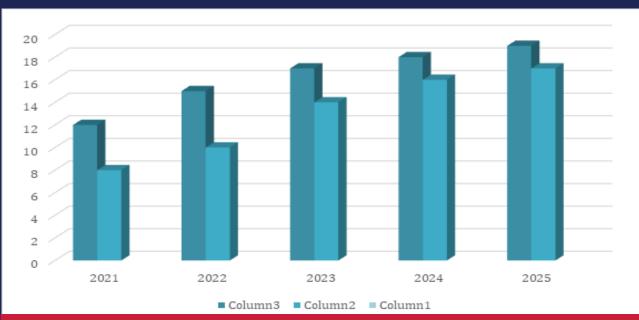
OPPORTUNITIES
